


# Preschool & Kindergarten

Students are studying about winter weather and snowmen. They also played with simulated snow and ice.




Kaylyn is sharing her bear.



Jesse is sharing his wooden logging truck. Students were impressed with the real log.


Looking for worms on a sunny day.




Lacey brought her pet bunnies for share day!

Learning about measurements, the class decided to see how many Laceys it would take to go from one side of the room to the other side.




Counting the beans from their estimation jar. They counted over 500 beans! That's a lot of tally marks!

contributed or bought and especially to those who did both!


